About the program

Dates: May 29 - June 12, 2016

Participants: Students of Conservatoire, Music School of Tbilisi. Participation is free of charge based on application process. The Jazz Department of Conservatoire and the visiting specialists from UofL will choose a maximum of 20 participants. A few places will be given to talented students from rural areas of Georgia and IDP's. (Also students are expected from Armenia and Azerbaijan.)

During and in addition to the 2-week program, the visiting specialists will provide public master classes for anyone who is interested in jazz music

Short description: Invited specialists will teach jazz saxophone and jazz guitar as well as conduct ensembles. The specialists will work with faculty development and with undergraduate students. 2-week program offers two courses in which the specialists can contribute their professional knowledge and experience. We believe the specialists can teach parts of these courses and also offer short seminars to students and professors.

The Kavkaz Jazz Festival was founded in 2010, under the auspices of USA Embassies in Tbilisi, Yerevan and Baku. For the first time in many years, we were able to gather musicians from all over the South Caucasus. It was an amazing and unforgettable event, which inspired us to hold this festival annualy. Kavkaz Jazz is a non-profit project supported by Tbilisi City Hall and Ministry of Culture and Monument Protection of Georgia since 2011.
