

Archil Ushveridze was born in Tbilisi, Georgia on 28 November, 1973. He graduated from Tbilisi State Conservatoire, Faculty of Choral Conducting with the major of Academic Choral Conducting (1st Grade Diploma) in 1997.

Archil Ushveridze has profound experience of working with different choral groups: Tbilisi State University Centre of Art and Culture, University Students Amateur Choir (1997 –2005), Tbilisi State Conservatoire Bachelor Students' Choir (2004 – 2008), Georgian State Musical Theatre (2004 – 2005).

Currently Archil Ushveridze is a head choral conductor of the Georgian State Academic Choir (Since April, 2005). Simultaneously, he leads the course for the Tbilisi State Conservatoire Master Students' Choir (Since, 2008) and is a choral master of Tbilisi Musical School #28, Boys' Folk Choir "Bichebi", which he has been leading since 1992.

Archil Ushveridze has participated in different professional activities and master classes, including: Zurich Music High School, Department of Academic Choir Conducting, Zurich, Switzerland (March- May 1998), Frieder Bernius Master Class on J.S. Bach's Motets, Namur, Belgium (July,1998), The Fifth Eric Ericson Master class for young choral conductors, Haarlem, The Netherlands (June-July, 2009). He was gained DAAD Scholarship for the research works in Goettingen University (October-December, 2010).

His teaching and performing repertoire comprises European and Georgian Choir Music from Renesaince to 20th century.

Currently Mr. Ushveridze is a PhD candidate at the Tbilisi State Conservatoire, Department of choir Conducting.
